







# Research Manitoba Funds COVID-19 Rapid Response Grants and Clinical Trials in Manitoba

**September 4, 2020 – Winnipeg, Manitoba.** Today Research Manitoba announced **\$3.8M** in research funding to support the recipients of the Manitoba COVID-19 Rapid Response Grant Competition and eight Manitoba clinical trials related to COVID-19 and applied health research. This funding has leveraged a further **\$5.6M** from our partners to provide a total of **\$9.4M** to support this essential work.

**\$2.2M** for Research Manitoba to fund 13 Rapid Response Grants and to partner on one Canadian Institutes of Health Research - Operating Grant from the COVID-19 Rapid Research Funding Opportunity.

Additional funding to support these grants comes from partnerships with:

- Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) \$1,589,795
- CancerCare Manitoba Foundation (CCMF) \$122,154
- Children's Hospital Research Institute of Manitoba (CHRIM) \$50,000
- Total leveraged from partners \$1.8M

**\$1.6M** to support Manitoba's participation in, and/or lead on, eight clinical trials related to COVID-19 led by Dr. Ryan Zarychanski.

Additional funding to support these clinical trials comes from partnerships with:

- Canadian Institutes of Health Research (CIHR) \$3.57M
- CancerCare Manitoba Foundation (CCMF) \$100,000
- Victoria General Hospital Foundation (VGHF) \$100,000
- Total leveraged from partners \$3.77M

On April 8, 2020, a <u>\$5,000,000 COVID-19 Research Fund</u> to support Manitoba's response to the 2019 Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic was announced by Health, Seniors and Active Living Minister Cameron Friesen. The funds for the Rapid Response Grants and Clinical Trials are included in the Manitoba COVID-19 Research Fund.

On June 25, 2020, CIHR announced the results of their <u>COVID-19 May 2020 Rapid Research Funding</u> Opportunity Results. Dr. Meghan Azad received a CHIR/RMB partnered award and Dr. Ryan Zarychanski received CIHR funding.
