### Advancing Hip and Knee Joint Replacement Research in Manitoba

**June 30, 2021 – Winnipeg, Manitoba.** Today Research Manitoba and the Concordia Foundation announced a partnership and \$500,000 in research funding to support Dr. Thomas Turgeon as the Arthroplasty Research Chair at Concordia's Hip and Knee Replacement Institute. This five-year Research Chair position will allow Dr. Turgeon and researchers at Concordia's Hip and Knee Institute to take a step forward in delivering world-class treatment, improving operating room efficiencies, and accelerating innovative approaches to healing the growing number of Manitobans living with hip and knee pain and disability.
